#### **Price Increases**

Please accept this advance notice that our pre-school hourly rates are planned to increase to £6 per hour after the Easter break. This is a 50p increase per hour (non-funded hours) and is necessary to cover our increased running costs.

Our school meal cost is rising to £2.40/meal (for those in KS2 and pre-school). Once again, this cost increase reflects the increased costs of energy and ingredients.

We would really appreciate payment for dinners to be made in advance at the beginning of the week, where possible. We do understand that occasionally plans will change and this may not always be possible. You may wish to consider paying a lump sum at the beginning of a week, month or half term—to do this, change the amount on Eduspot and add the item to your basket. As we approach the end of the financial year, it is essential that outstanding debts are settled. We have a very large outstanding balance owed to school currently and we will be very grateful to everyone who clears their balance on Eduspot as soon as possible.

Any balances that remain outstanding after the half-term break will be investigated and dealt with in line with our charging and debt recovery policy. Sadly, the school is owed a large amount of money and it is essential you have a zero balance on the 31st March. Outstanding pre-school fees may result in your child's hours being cut to only those funded by the government. Outstanding dinner money fees may result in you having to provide a packed lunch for your child until the debt is settled.

We will begin our formal debt recovery process for outstanding payments from early next week. Those concerned will receive formal letters urgently requiring the payment to made.
