Understanding the world



We start by looking at our families and friends, comparing and contrasting how we all look. We have a big selection of mirrors to help with this! A popular part of this topic has been looking at all the different sorts of hair we have, the hairdresser role play is a firm favourite.

Communication and language.



The Early years curriculum has a big focus on the development of language. We will share stories, poems and rhymes on a daily basis. We will learn new and exciting words to add to our ever-growing vocabulary.

This term we will focus on number and place value to 5. We will develop our subitising skills. We will compare groups within 5 and learn our Number bonds to 5.

We will learn how to count orally to 10 and begin to know one more and one less of a given number.

There will be work on time, spatial reasoning and shape.
