

A message from the PTFA:



COMMUNITY APPEAL

The Rea Valley foodbank was set up in partnership with Shrewsbury Food Bank PLUS to provide parcels of donated food, toiletries, cleaning products and household items to individuals and families every week. These are unprecedented times of soaring energy bills alongside a huge rise in the cost of food and other necessary items, making foodbanks an essential service. Numerous Rea Valley households have faced hardship and during our first year we have given out 7 tons of produce.

Unfortunately, our incoming food/hygiene donations have fallen very short of that at just 2 tons and so far the Shrewsbury Food Bank Plus has made up our shortfall every week. While we may never be independent, it would be good if we were able to provide more of our own locally donated items.

We desperately need in-date tinned and packet foodstuff, toiletries, cleaning products, pet food and nappies. If you are able to donate and can help us to help others in our community please drop off at the following venues, at the dates and times listed.
